# Story & Questions

Two Visions and One People (READ Acts 10:1-41 in the sections listed below): As you read this story, consider it in three different scenes.

Scene 1 - Read Acts 10:1-8 - Cornelius' Vision

- What are things we learn about Cornelius? (He's a powerful Roman soldier, he's not a Jew, but he "fears God" - which means he's a devout Gentile who is seeking after God, and he's generous and prayerful)
- What was the vision he received and who did he receive it from? (An angel called him by name and told him to send for Peter, with lots of details of where to find Peter!)
- Since the angel doesn't tell Cornelius WHY he is to send for Peter, what does Cornelius' obedience show us about a life of faith? (Sometimes we only know the very next step that God is calling us to in our lives, but still we trust him, one step at a time.)

Scene 2 - Read Acts 10:9-23 - Peter's Vision

- What are things we know about Peter in this story? (Well, from earlier in Acts we know he is one of Jesus' first and closest disciples, and in this story he is HUNGRY! And he also had a vision on a rooftop.)
- What was the vision he received and how did he respond? (Since Jews had all kinds of rules about what was clean/unclean and what we should eat/not eat, God in this vision showed Peter that he needed a new understanding of clean/unclean.)
- How was Peter obedient to the Spirit's call in his life? (Since Peter had received a new insight on God making formerly "unclean" thing "clean," Peter welcomed these Gentile strangers into his house overnight and then went with them back to Cornelius the next day.)

Scene 3 - Read Acts 10:24-41 - One people, since God shows no favoritism As Peter is welcomed into Cornelius' house, they both share about their visions and Peter declares that the old rules that prevented Jews and Gentiles from being friends were being changed by the love of Jesus! And the church became open to ALL people who love Jesus and want to follow him together.

- What do these words of Peter ("that God does not show favoritism") mean for us today? As a family, think about three different ways this

could encourage us to NOT look at others as different, but instead as people we can become friends with.

### Activities



Make Welcome Signs: Using paper, markers, stickers, crayons, or whatever you have lying around your home already to make signs to welcome people to your home, like Cornelius welcomed Peter!
